DAILY DISCIPLINES FOR GREATNESS

DAY 1 - Read Joshua chapter 1. Underline the phrase “strong and courageous” every time it appears in this chapter. What does it mean to be “strong and courageous”? Why was it important that God told His people to be “strong and courageous”? Why is it important for you to know to be “strong and courageous”?

DAY 2 - Read Joshua chapter 2. Why do you believe that the Lord used a harlot (prostitute) to protect His people? Can you think of other people in the Bible that the Lord used regardless of their sins? Do sins disqualify us from service in the Kingdom of God?

DAY 3 - Read Joshua chapter 3. The people followed the Ark of the Covenant which was the representation of the presence of the Lord. How do you allow God’s presence to lead you and guide you? Be practical. What is the miracle that happened in verses 9-17?

DAY 4 - Read Joshua chapter 4. What were the 12 stones to memorialize? Why is it important to remember the blessings and miracles of God? What are your 12 memorial stones?

DAY 5 - Read Joshua chapter 5. List 5 lessons that you learn from verses 13-15.

DAY 6 - Read Joshua chapter 6. List 5 lessons that you learn from this chapter.

DAY 7 - Read Psalm chapter 10. Read it twice. Have you ever asked God some of these same questions? How do the last 3 verse encourage you?
