## DAILY DISCIPLINES FOR GREATNESS

- **Day 1 -** Read Esther Chapter 1. Describe Ahasuerus in 5 words based on what you read in this chapter. Do you believe that Vashti should have obeyed the king's command in verse 12? How do you handle people who have a problem with anger? **Day 2 -** Read Esther Chapter 2. Describe both Mordecai and Esther in 5 words based on what you read in this chapter. How is Mordecai different than Ahasuerus? How is Esther different than Vashti?
- Day 3 Read Esther Chapter 3. Describe Haman in 5 words. Why did Mordecai decide not to bow? What are some of the things that you bow to that you need to re-evaluate? Day 4 Read Esther Chapter 4 & 5. Was Mordecai's reaction appropriate or inappropriate? Read Esther 4:14 again. What is your purpose? Why have you been born?
- **Day 5 -** Read Esther 6 & 7. Who turned this situation around? What turned this situation around? There is always a "who" and a "what". What situation in your life needs to be turned around? How should you follow Esther's example?
- **Day 6 -** Read Esther 8. Read verses 16 & 17 again. Underline the significant words in these verses. Remind yourself that these words are God's will for your life in every situation!
- **Day 7 -** Read Esther 9 & 10. How is Mordecai remembered? Look at Esther 9:4 and Esther 10:3. What do you want your legacy to be? What choices did Mordecai make that ensured him this legacy?
